Our Curriculum

We have designed our very own curriculum for our pupils based on their interests and needs.

Our pupils' learning is based on a different theme each half term. We use high-quality books to provide children with opportunities to make links across subjects and develop a love of reading. One of the most important aspects of our curriculum is Personal and Social Education (PSE). PSE is a key part of each half-term's theme, including stories from around the world.

We have designed our curriculum to give pupils opportunities for collaborative, 'hands-on' learning, with lots of trips and visitors to help enhance classroom learning.

Behaviour Policy



Our Behaviour Policy is built around the five key values of Hawksworth Wood: respect, resilience, independence, curiosity, and aspiration.

Ensuring good behaviour allows us to work towards these values and support your child's learning in a calm and safe environment.

We expect all pupils to model safe, kind behaviours that allow everyone to learn. No matter where they are, children should follow our three golden rules:

Be kind. Be safe. Be ready to learn.

We aim to reassure, encourage, and inspire all our learners. We use a variety of approaches to motivate pupils, build self-esteem, and acknowledge effort and achievement. This includes individual rewards such as Star Certificates and Jewel Card points, as well as the chance to earn rewards as part of a group. We also encourage children to make the right choices about their behaviour by providing clear directions regarding consequences of various actions. These are displayed throughout the

school so that pupils fully understand our expectations and the various consequence systems in place to support these.



Pupils' behaviour in all classes, in the hall and at breaktimes is calm and sensible. They are friendly, polite and well-mannered.



Attendance

Regularly attending school is linked to raising children's achievement, as well as developing skills for life and work.

We believe that working together with parents is the best way to promote positive attendance. We ask that parents and carers ensure that their child attends school regularly and arrives ready to learn.

We also do our bit to promote good attendance by providing lots of rewards, certificates and prizes to recognise children who attend school on-time and regularly.











Hawksworth Wood is a nurturing school, and our staff believe that our pupils learn better when they feel happy and safe.

We recognise that every pupil is unique. Therefore, we work together to make sure the needs of all children are met on an individual basis.

Teachers plan carefully to cater for all abilities, ensuring that all pupils are provided with challenging learning activities, experience success, and make progress.

Early identification of children with Special Educational or Additional Needs allows us to offer those pupils support from the start of their school journey with us. We work with parents to make sure that support is maintained, monitored, and reviewed for as long as deemed necessary. This may include a place in our Orchard class, where children are taught in a small group following a personalised timetable and curriculum.




